Event Location: Camp Wokanda, Mossville IL

Take Rt. 29 north towards Chillicothe & turn left onto Old Galena Road (just North of Rt. 6) go past Mossville Grade School, turn left on Boy Scout Road & and proceed to the park entrance.

Parent Attendance Required? YES

Event Cost: \$20 (1 scout & 1 parent total) (checks payable to Pack 73)

Dress: **Uniform Class B (T-Shirt) Casual

Sign Up Available Between NOW and 01/13/2010 (on the pack website).

If registered after 1/13, the fee goes up to \$30 (1 scout & 1 parent total)

Turn in completed medical forms (for each scout, & parent) & a waiver if camping.

Event Description: The 2011 Cub Scout Yukon Camp at Camp Wokanda in Mossville, IL is on January 22nd (camping on 1/21 – 1/23). All registered scouts & their parents are invited to spend the day like the prospectors and adventurers of the Yukon Territory, with fun in the snow (we hope), games, team challenges, plenty of hot chocolate & more. Cost for this event is \$20 (which includes 1 scout and 1 parent/adult, +\$10 for each additional scout or parent). If you sign up after the deadline the cost goes up to \$30 (or \$15 for each additional scout/parent).

*Reminder: All Adult Partner must accompany their scout.

Pack 73 has the Cherokee cabin reserved & this is conveniently located in the valley near all of the activities, so that the scouts can go & get warm easily if needed (even if you are not staying overnight).

Items to Bring for Saturday activities only: 2 Cans of Chicken noodle Soup or Chili to share for Lunch on Saturday. Water bottle (Wokanda's water has a strong iron taste), snacks, a great attitude & weather dependent items: boots, hat, three pairs of socks (wool preferred), two pair of gloves, sweater, winter jacket, thermal underwear (if you have it), extra clothes (due to wetness)

Optional Items: Camera, binoculars, paper & pencil, nature books, personal first aid kit. We recommend you carry these few items in a small backpack. Clearly mark all items with your name and pack number (73).

Items to Bring if camping: Items above, a cabin is available but space is limited to 12 beds & is on a first come first serve (or you can bring your tent if you truly want to rough it), sleeping items (pillow, blanket/sleeping bag, etc.), spare clothes, bathroom supplies (toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, washcloth, towel, & brush), **food** (Friday dinner, Saturday breakfast), snacks, & a great attitude. Also a couple crafts for the scouts to do will be supplied.

TENT CAMPING - If you are interested in sleeping in a tent, you could earn your Polar Bear Patch from the council.

FOOD - The following food will be provided by the pack: Saturday dinner (hotdogs, baked beans, s'mores) & Sunday breakfast (pancakes & sausage).

Ground Rules:
